Siegfried Sassoon (1886-1967), winner of the Military Cross (awarded for gallantry during active operations against the enemy) was an English poet, writer, and soldier.

Today we will use what we learned about writing an introduction and thesis statement to create a literary response and write a five paragraph essay to answer this guiding question: **How does**Sassoon describe the two worlds in his poem "Dreamers?" Compare these two worlds.

Dreamers Soldiers are citizens of death's gray land, 1 Drawing no dividend from time's to-morrows.² In the great hour of destiny they stand, 4...dug-out (line 9): Each with his feuds, and jealousies, and sorrows.
