Materials:

Class Work:

<u>Homework:</u>

This is work that is assigned to be completed at home. This includes document interpretation, questions, creative projects, essays and study time. Acceptance of **late assignments** is at the teacher's discretion.

Absences:

If a student is absent, it is his/her responsibility to request any handouts or assignments that they may have missed.
